1. Please describe the boundaries of your township.
2. Who are the present officers and where do they live in the township?
3. How is the selection of officers decided? Are there campaigns?
4. Does your township have an annual business meeting attended by all citizens to conduct business? If so, please describe the last meeting—attendance, procedure, issues discussed, and decisions made.
5. What is the township budget? Explain the sources of money and also the major expenditures in an annual budget.
6. Are there any issues in the township that cause disagreement among people in the township?
7. What would you say are the most important functions performed by township government?
8. Since townships can only do what state law authorizes, do townships have enough flexibility to make the decisions that need to be made?
9. Sometimes, townships contract with other governments for services, such as road maintenance, etc. How much contracting for services is done by the township with private parties or neighboring governments?
10. Are there any relationships between township government and county government?
11. Over half of the local governments in North Dakota are townships, many with very few people. What would be the advantages and disadvantages of consolidating townships into bigger units?
12. What is your feeling about the future of township government in North Dakota?
